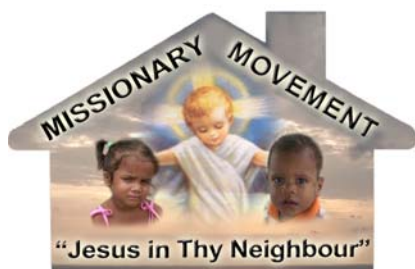

The non-profitable, philanthropic **Missionary Movement "Jesus in Thy Neighbour"** ([www.maltamission.com](http://www.maltamission.com)) WAS founded in Gozo - Malta on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December 1987 by Msgr. George Grima (e-mail: [gfpmta@gmail.com](mailto:gfpmta@gmail.com)). It was approved by the Bishop of Gozo, Msgr. Nikol Cauchi, on 30<sup>th</sup> October 1992. Its aim was to give a better life to so many children living on the streets of Brazil. Today the Missionary Movement

is run by Msgr. George Grima with a particular council and the support of about 30,000 Maltese financial contributors, and good wishers from America, Italy and Gibraltar. All supported projects must have the local bishop's approval.

The Missionary Movement cares for the lives of poor children by providing them:

- daily food;
- education on daily basis,
- medicine where needed;
- caring for disabled children and spreading the belief that disability is not inability;
- homes for leper families;
- bore-holes and spring water development.



All children supported by the Missionary Movement are under the age of 12. Currently, the Missionary Movement has: ■ 85 homes in Brazil ■ 87 homes in Ethiopia ■ 24 homes in Kenya. We run homes for HIV-infected children, for deaf and dumb children, children with leprosy, as well as disabled children.



The biggest project currently being built is in Bondo - Kenya. A three-in-one project to receive children suffering from AIDS, dumb and deaf, blind and albinos.

In collaboration with Brittany's Hope of America in Injabara - Ethiopia we are also building a big project for orphan babies.

In collaboration with the Parish Priest Msgr. Cheffo, parish priest of Saint Mary Magdalen Church of Media, Pennsylvania, we will built a new home for AIDS orphans. The blessing of the foundations and first stone of the St. Mary Magdalen Oasis of Peace in Nyamonge, Kenya, will be blessed by the Parish Priest himself in the beginning of October 2010.

Pope John Paul II in one of his journeys to Africa, in front of so much poverty and illness, said, with a loud and steady voice: **"Misery seeks love and charity to live."**

## BABY THROWN IN A HOLE

One day, while I was in the orphanage, I heard a dog barking with all his strength. After some time, he began to whine. With his movements he made us understand that he wanted us to follow him.



One of our nuns left all she was doing and together with another woman, they followed the dog. He led them to the woods and stopped at a hole where there was a half-dead baby. Around the hole there were a lot of flies and insects. Only the head of the baby was visible.



The women dug around the baby as fast as they could and pulled him out. The nun saw that part of his head was showing because the dog had dug around it in an attempt to allow the baby to breathe, then he went to seek help. The baby was so weak that his cry was hardly audible. They brought the baby to the hospital and, with a lot of love, they washed him, and cared for him.



The baby had been born at only 8 months and he was buried within 24 hours of his birth. At the hospital they cut his umbilical cord and gave him all the care he needed. They named the baby Victor, because life was victorious over death.
